Please save the following 2016 dates in your calendar:

- March 1: Start of early registration for Major and Junior
- **April 30**: End of early registration for Major
- **May 31**: End of regular registration; start of late registration for Major and Junior
- June 28 – 29: Setup days for teams in Major Leagues
- June 29: Setup days for teams in Junior Leagues
- June 30 – July 4: Competitions in Major and Junior leagues
- July 4: RoboCup Symposium Day

3 Leipzig - Host of RoboCup 2016

Leipzig is a vibrant metropolis with a 1,000-year-long history in trade and exhibitions. The city is centrally located in the East of Germany and the heart of Europe. It is excellently connected and easily reachable via several international airports. It is an important traffic and transportation hub in Germany and has one of the most modern exhibition centers in Europe.

Leipzig achieved world fame in 1989 as the “city of heroes” with the peaceful revolution, which started in Leipzig and paved the way for the reunification of Germany and the unification of Europe. The city is rich in history and culture. Great composers like Bach, Mendelssohn, and Wagner, and writers like Goethe and Schiller lived and worked here.

Today, Leipzig is experiencing a boom in culture, arts and lifestyle and is considered the “new Berlin.” Leipzig is nowadays the most livable city in Germany and ranked in the Top 3 European cities with the highest living quality.

4 Event Highlights

RoboCup 2016 will feature several innovative events and activities:

- The RoboCup Federation has launched a Call for Proposals for standard platforms for a RoboCup@Home-SPL league. The Call has seen a lot of interest and many proposals for sophisticated platforms for domestic service robots have been submitted. The Federation has invited the best proposals to showcase and demonstrate their robots or prototypes at RoboCup 2016, after which a selection committee will make its choice for a standard @Home platform.
- Amazon Robotics decided to embed and co-locate their Amazon Picking Challenge (APC) with RoboCup 2016 in Leipzig. <http://www.robocup2016.org/press-releases/amazon-picking-challenge-perfect-merchandise-logistics/384752>
- The International Federation for Automation and Control (IFAC) decided to co-locate its 2016 Intelligent Autonomous Vehicles (IAV) conference with RoboCup 2016. <http://iav2016.inf.h-brs.de>
- With RoboCamp 2016, an event formerly known as RoboParty, an interactive event for children and parents will be organized during RoboCup 2016 and allow strong engagement of the general public in our activities.

More events and activities are still in planning stage and will be announced in due time.

5 Participation

There are three ways to participate in RoboCup:

1. in a Major league team
2. in a Junior league team
3. in the RoboCup Symposium

Major League teams must successfully pass a league-specific qualification process, which is already underway for some time. Most leagues have recently closed or are about to close their qualification process. Please check the leagues' web sites.

Junior League teams must qualify through regional competitions. The qualification process is handled by the Junior national or regional representatives.

The **RoboCup Symposium** has published its Call for Papers, which has been distributed over all RoboCup and other robotics mailing lists. The due date for submitting full papers is **March 11, 2016**. 7 Preliminary Visa Information

Participants from the following countries will **NOT** require a visa:

Argentina, Australia, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Croatia, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, Korea (ROK, South Korea), Latvia, Lithuania, Malaysia, Mexico, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Singapore, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Taiwan, United Kingdom, United States of America

Participants from the following countries **WILL** require a visa:

China (POC), Egypt, India, Indonesia, Iran, Jordan, Kuwait, Philippines, Russian Federation, Saudi Arabia, South Africa, Turkey

Due to regulatory restrictions, invitation letters for visa applications can be issued by the hosting organization **only after** participants **have registered and fully paid** their registration fees. This implies, of course, successful qualification for participation in RoboCup 2016 as described in Section 5 above, because only qualified teams and members of qualified teams will be able to register for RoboCup 2016.
